Rodney Myrick tells about his lifesaving heart attack care.



Tucked away in our chest, beating about 100,000 times per day and powering approximately 2,000 gallons of blood throughout our bodies, is our heart.* Most of us take this vital organ for granted, noticing it mostly after exertion, a bout of heartburn, a nightmare or – most seriously – chest pain.

Know the warning signs of a possible **heart attack**

While some heart attacks occur suddenly, the American Heart Association says that most start slowly with mild pain or discomfort.

CALL 911 IF YOU EXPERIENCE:

- Pain or discomfort in the chest
- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body, including the arms, back, neck, jaw or stomach
- Shortness of breath (with or without chest discomfort)
- Other signs, including breaking out in a cold sweat, lightheadedness, nausea or vomiting

When Rodney Myrick suddenly felt pain in his chest and then down his arm and in his jaw, he knew right away what was happening. "Unfortunately, this was my second heart attack," he says.

Myrick had no doubt that he was in good hands when he arrived in the emergency room at Henderson Hospital for emergency cardiac care. He's worked for The Valley Health System (VHS) for over a decade and has been running the Sterile Processing Department at Henderson Hospital since it opened in 2016. He has great trust in all of the VHS facilities and says that receiving treatment in "his" hospital was particularly special. What stood out most was how caring the staff was, as well as the quality of care he received, he says.

To treat his cardiac emergency, Myrick underwent coronary angioplasty to open two narrowed arteries and restore blood flow to his heart. He returned a month later to have a third artery treated. "I got excellent care," he says, noting that the emergency team acted swiftly to provide treatment within the prescribed window and support the best possible outcomes. "I feel absolutely wonderful," he says.

"I'm determined I'm going to live a long life; this isn't going to slow it down," says Myrick, who is a husband, father and grandfather. Recognizing his symptoms and getting treated quickly saved his life a second time. "I just want people to know if you're having chest pain, get it looked at. It's a chance to continue living and be there for the next day."

A high standard of HEART CARE

All Valley Health System hospitals have received Chest Pain Center Accreditation with **Primary Percutaneous Coronary** Intervention (PCI) by the American College of Cardiology. Hospitals with this designation have proven exceptional competency in treating patients with heart attack symptoms and have primary PCI, also known as coronary angioplasty, available 24/7 every day. This is a non-surgical procedure that opens narrowed or blocked coronary arteries with a balloon to relieve symptoms of heart disease or reduce heart damage during or after a heart attack.



Just the LEG UP she needed!

A fter breaking her leg in a biking accident just days before her 60th birthday, Lori Temple was determined to get the healing started immediately. She had surgery at Desert Springs Hospital to help repair the damage and was thrilled to be able to move into the hospital's Inpatient Rehabilitation Center for intensive therapy. "The people there took me into their arms," she says. "It was really impactful what they did to help me get better." >

Temple has a busy career as chief information officer for the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, and she needed to learn how to tackle certain everyday tasks before she could return to her routine and her home. The staff picked up on her energy and tailored her care around what would work for her.

"It was very clear that the objective every day was to help patients get from where they were to the next step," Temple recalls. "The compassionate, comprehensive care is amazing."

During the week and a half she spent in the rehab center, she had a minimum of three hours of intensive therapy five days per week, and 24-hour nursing support to provide extra comfort and reassurance.

"I wasn't able to put any weight at all on my foot," she explains. In physical therapy, she did exercises to strengthen her arms and other muscles – the kinds of exercises that would make it possible for her to go home.

With help from occupational therapists, she was able to master personal tasks, like getting dressed and making her bed. Her spouse took pictures of their house, including their bathroom and hallways, so the rehab team could arrange for the equipment Temple would need when she went home.

"The home transition was amazing," Temple says. "I could get dressed by myself, take a bath by myself, wheel around the house by myself." She also began working from home as she continued exercises to support her ongoing recovery. "To be able to do all those things when I came home was so important."

She's tackled all of the hard work with a sense of humor and continues to be inspired when she thinks about her hospital team and the therapist who would push her to do "five more."

"I couldn't have been happier with the rehab center," she says. ■




